

Larry Lonik

January 31, 1949 -
April 15, 2003

It's hard to believe that ten years can go by so rapidly. But, they say that life is like a roll of toilet paper; the closer you get to the end, the faster it goes. I don't think Larry knew the end was approaching.

He had stayed overnight, as he often did, on Tuesday, April 8. We shared a bottle of wine that evening, as we also often did. He said that our home near Magnolia was "four hours from anywhere" and since we were mutual customers of each other, his overnight stops were convenient to save us both on shipping charges. And, since he was always on the road, we wouldn't have known where to ship to anyway.

As he drove down our driveway, he taunted "I'll be pickin' mushrooms tomorrow". He was on his way to Missouri for an annual morel expedition with friends. The hunt usually was while riding mules. However, Larry had won a four-wheeler at the Minnesota Sports show that year and purchased a trailer to tow it behind his van. He was anxious to try it out in the woods.



As I understand it, during the hunt on April 15, one of his front wheels became tangled in a vine and the four-wheeler gently rolled over. Larry was tall enough that he merely stepped off as it rolled and was not injured in the process. He then uprighted the vehicle and drove it back to the farm house where he was staying.

While feasting on morels at dinner that evening he complained of some shoulder pain but protested when his friends said he should go to the hospital for x-rays. The friends insisted and took him to the local hospital to get checked over. The x-rays showed nothing and he was basically given a clean bill of health. But, while being discharged, he collapsed and the hospital personnel were unable to revive him. The coroner's report listed the cause of

death as heart failure. It was possibly from the stress of uprighting the four-wheeler.

If Larry knew he had a heart problem, he didn't share that knowledge with

anyone. He wasn't overweight and didn't smoke, he seemed to be a poster boy for living a healthy lifestyle.

The knowledge he did share was about morels. He made dozens of appearances annually, authored three books on

the subject, and produced three videos (his *Motherlode* is still the ultimate morel movie and it's not even a "how to"). He helped start Morel Mountain, the first facility to grow morels indoors on a year round basis. He later grew morels indoors in his own facility.

Being 6' 7" tall, Larry was a giant among men. But, in a magic place I call Moreldom, he was gargantuan. Larry did more to promote morels than any other ten people I'm aware of. He had been featured in various newspaper, magazine, radio and TV appearances, including CBS News "Sunday Morning with Charles Osgood," Mother Earth News, The Food Network, The Wall Street Journal, CNN, National Public Radio and Martha Stewart Living.

As we talked morels over that bottle of wine that night, Larry's dreams and goals were greater than ever and knew no limits. He and his business had so many facets, most people couldn't even comprehend keeping it all organized. Yet Larry managed it (with help from Shelly Mazur, Jan Manning, and others) while being on the road five months of the year.

Mere words could never express the gratitude I feel having known Larry. Nor could they ever describe the void I feel realizing it may be a while before we go pickin' and grinnin' together again. Until then, Shroom On and Stay Curious. To quote a line from the movie *The Sandlot*, "Heroes get remembered, but legends never die."

As reported last issue, the first morels found in the Central United States were on March 1 in Georgia. As of April 14, they are still picking! That's a six-week season. Chris Matherly of morelmushroomhunting.com reports that Georgia has had four fruitings and that they have found one-inch greys growing next to ten-inch yellows. Let's hope that trend continues north.

I thought we'd be finding some here in Central Illinois by this weekend. As of Monday, April 8 we had hit the ground temp of 46 degrees but it's at 41 this morning, April 14. At this point it's only a matter of days - or hours. And possibly only a matter of when am I gonna go check my early spots.




